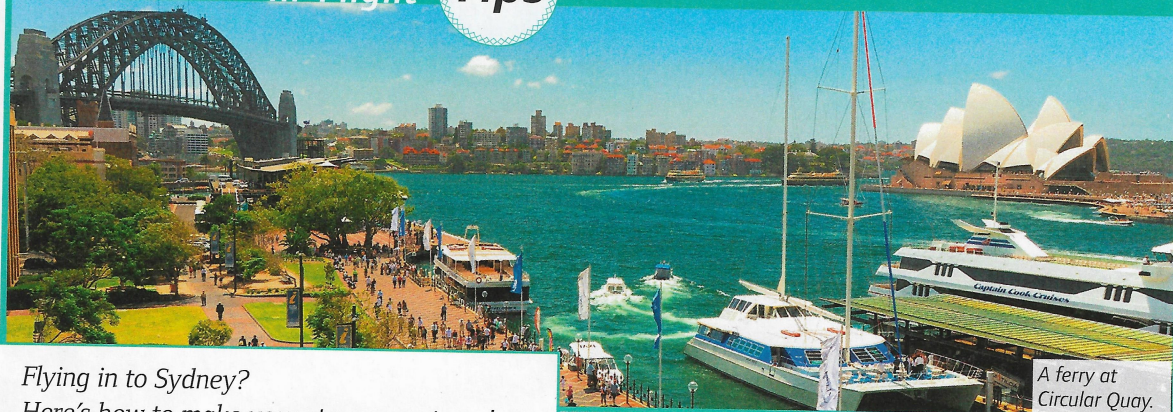

Flying in to Sydney?

Here's how to make your stay a great one!

A ferry at Circular Quay.

Stay in **The Rocks**, the lively historical quarter where the first convicts settled in the 1790s. Or in the trendy suburb of **Woolloomooloo** with its beautiful wharf. From there, it's a short walk through the **Royal Botanic Gardens** into the city, to the crowds and skyscrapers of the Central Business District (CBD). On the way, you'll see the flying foxes hanging from the trees and, of course, the world-famous **Sydney Opera House**.

The best way to see Sydney's **stunning harbour** is to head for **Circular Quay** and jump on one of the ferries going to **Manly**. At the end of the half-hour ride, a five-minute walk through Manly takes you to its beautiful ocean beach.

After an ice cream in one of the cafés at Circular Quay, wander round the waterfront and enjoy all the street performers, like the great **Aboriginal didgeridoo players**. Or head for the **Museum of Contemporary Art** and go on a teen-guided tour to get a young person's fresh and honest take on the museum's works.

If you've still got some energy, don't catch the ferry back – walk the **Manly Scenic Walkway** along the water, across the northern harbour beaches and through **Sydney Harbour National Park**. Watch the sailing boats, wind and kitesurfers along the route and then catch a bus back to the city from **Spit Bridge**.

If it's night and winter and the **Vivid Sydney** festival is on, look out across the water from the museum and watch the light show transforming the Opera House and other Sydney landmarks into magical, colourful works of art changing from minute to minute.

Sydney has more than 100 beautiful, sandy beaches along its harbour and waterfront. So, if you're looking for the perfect wave to surf or a kitesurfing paradise, calm water for a relaxing swim, a quiet corner to read a book or a busier place to watch the people, you'll find the right spot in Sydney.
